This annual luncheon draws over 600 attendees, making it one of the Chamber's largest events of the year. Mayor Harold Copenhaver delivers a keynote address highlighting Jonesboro's progress, challenges, and opportunities for the future, bringing together business and civic leaders to align around city initiatives.





#### AgriBusiness Breakfast

The Agri-Business Breakfast celebrates the agricultural industry's vital role in Northeast Arkansas. A highlight of the event is the presentation of the Chamber's Agri-Business Person of the Year, along with the Chamber's Farmer of the Year. In addition, funds are raised for the Chamber's Agri-Business Scholarship, which has supported more than 80 local students pursuing agricultural education over the years.

#### **DEVELOPMENT**

Building leaders, workforce skills, and future talent.

#### Leadership Jonesboro

Leadership Jonesboro is the Chamber's flagship leadership development program, with a nearly 40-year history and more than 1,000 graduates. Through community projects and interactive sessions, participants gain insight into key regional issues while building strong professional networks.





#### Junior Leadership

Junior Leadership introduces an annual average of 30 high school juniors to leadership principles and community engagement. The program fosters early civic involvement and helps students explore pathways for future leadership. Graduates receive certificates and special graduation cords.



### Jonesboro Young Professionals Network (JYPN)

JYPN provides opportunities for networking, professional development, social engagement and community service projects designed to help members thrive in both career and civic life. The group has 130 members and growing. Also, JYPN hosts an annual conference featuring keynote speakers and breakout sessions that strengthen skills and build connections among young leaders.

#### **Emerging Leaders**

Emerging Leaders pairs mentorship with high-impact leadership training to prepare mid-career professionals for greater roles in the community. The program is based around small groups and participants engage in strengths-based development, mentorship, and networking designed to accelerate growth.

#### **Arkansas Scholars**

Our Workforce Development Committee is proud to recognize graduating seniors in Craighead County with the Arkansas Scholars award. It's one of our favorite initiatives! It's an opportunity to highlight the hard work and achievements of local high school students. Also under the umbrella of Arkansas Scholars, our Committee creates and provides digital resources and expert insights to help students stay in school and prepare for future careers.

#### **Student Recognition**

Each spring, the Chamber's Workforce Development Committee celebrates approximately 85 exceptional elementary students through the Student Recognition Award program. These students have demonstrated remarkable resilience—overcoming personal or academic challenges while making positive choices that inspire others. Honorees are celebrated with a backpack filled with prizes, a certificate of achievement, and a medal to commemorate their accomplishment.





#### **TECH TALENT SCHOLARSHIP**

Our Workforce Development Committee supports local students pursuing technical education in high-demand fields at ASUN Jonesboro, addressing workforce needs. The Committee had extra funding in 2025 and instead of awarding one scholarship of \$1,000, they were able to award three \$1,000 scholarships.

#### Jonesboro Regional Chamber Annual Meeting

The Chamber's Annual Meeting brings together more than 400 business and civic leaders for networking, community recognition, and future planning. Highlights include the presentation of key Chamber awards, the passing of the gavel for Chamber Board Chairs, and a keynote address—this year featuring Destinee Rogers, A-State Head Women's Basketball Coach, as the 2025 speaker.



#### **CHAMBER PARTNERS**

Chamber Partners are Goodwill Ambassadors who are paired with Members for their first three months of membership. During this time, Ambassadors serve as their connection point by inviting them to events, ensuring they stay informed about Chamber activities, and helping them navigate their new membership. This program allows new members to build relationships directly with fellow members rather than relying solely on staff. Many new members find this especially valuable, as it gives them a friendly contact for questions and makes it easier to get connected within the Chamber community.



# **Existing Industries Association**

The Existing Industries Association celebrated its annual Golf Outing, bringing manufacturers together for a day of camaraderie, friendly competition, and team-building. This year, 52 golfers from 13 companies hit the course, many of them loyal participants year after year.



#### JONESBORO PARKS & RECREATION

The Chamber is proud to partner with Jonesboro Parks & Recreation, an organization that has accomplished so much this year to enhance our community. Together, we have celebrated new improvements across the parks system with ribbon cuttings, supported the introduction of new signage, assisted with events like the Skirmish, and volunteered at various community activities. We truly value the dedication of Jonesboro Parks & Recreation in improving the quality of life in Jonesboro and are grateful for the opportunity to support their efforts.

#### MYJONESBOROJOBS.COM

For years, the Jonesboro Regional Chamber has provided its members an opportunity to find and recruit talent through the collective effort of the Chamber's workforce development initiatives, and with the recent upgrades to <a href="www.myjonesborojobs.com">www.myjonesborojobs.com</a> (MYJJ), this effort has accelerated. The new portal, <a href="www.myjonesborojobs.com">www.myjonesborojobs.com</a>, is a web portal which seamlessly allows our members to post positions without additional log-ins or passwords. By enrolling, members provide a URL where their existing job posts take place, and MYJJ goes to work crawling your native board and replicating those posts under the member's company tile on the job portal. When an applicant navigates to your listing on MYJJ, they are instantly transitioned to your native career post, eliminating multiple applications or log-ins. As you update your job postings, positions are added or removed from MYJJ within 24 hours, eliminating the need for your talent directors to track posts and expiration dates.



When updating our career portal, we not only made significant improvements to the user interface for both members and applicants but also developed a marketing strategy around the portal with real dollars. We manage this marketing package with the cooperative dollars of the companies participating, ensuring we are able to place more eyes on the high-wage, in-demand positions throughout our community. In the last year alone we have had more than 35,000 people view companies on MYJJ, with more out of market talent attraction campaigns on the horizon.

#### **Bike Race**



#### **New Member Luncheons**

Member events are an important way the Chamber connects and engages with its members throughout the year. We host two **New Member Luncheons** annually, giving new members the opportunity to learn more about the Chamber and discover how they can get involved. Last year more than 160 members attended these luncheons.







#### **Membership Appreciation Luncheons**

**Membership Appreciation Luncheons** are designed to bring new and long-time members together for networking and fellowship. The first event is a drive-thru breakfast with coffee and donuts, while the second is a fun outdoor cookout in the Chamber's back parking lot featuring music, hamburgers, and great company. Both events are free for all members, and last year, our ambassadors served more than 559 members.

#### **Prime Time Event**

Our **Prime Time Event** offers new members the chance to showcase their businesses and connect with both new and seasoned members. With over 400 attendees last year, this event continues to be a highlight for networking and visibility within the Chamber community.



#### **Operation Thank You**

One of our largest annual initiatives is **Operation Thank You**, where our Goodwill Ambassadors travel across town delivering membership stickers and the Jonesboro City Guide to every Chamber member. Each year, Ambassadors hand-deliver more than 1,000 packets, putting a friendly face to the Chamber and strengthening connections across the community.

#### **Ribbon Cuttings**

Ribbon Cuttings and Groundbreakings are one of the Chamber's most celebrated traditions. With the help of our Goodwill Ambassadors, we hosted more than 150 ribbon cuttings and groundbreakings this year. These events provide an excellent opportunity to network with both new and established businesses, whether it's a grand opening, an expansion, a remodel, or another exciting milestone. Each ribbon cutting offers valuable exposure for businesses, often including Chamber Ambassadors, city representatives, and even the mayor. #### **Business Expo**

The Jonesboro Regional Chamber of Commerce Business Expo, held each April, is the largest business-to-business expo in Arkansas. This premier event brings together hundreds of organizations of all types and sizes, offering them the opportunity to showcase their products and services under one roof. In 2025, the Expo featured over 185 booths and welcomed more than 4,000 attendees. For the first time, the event also included the *Taste of Jonesboro*, featuring over 30 local restaurants and food vendors. It was a fantastic addition and a huge success.
